#### **SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES**

General Advice: Consult a physician. Show this SDS. Move out of dangerous area.

If Inhaled: Allow the victim to rest in a well-ventilated area. Seek immediate medical attention.

In case of skin contact: After contact with skin, wash immediately with plenty of water. Gently and thoroughly wash the contaminated skin with running water and

non-abrasive soap. Be particularly careful to clean folds, crevices, creases and groin. Cold water may be used. Cover the irritated skin

with an emollient. If irritation persists, seek medical attention. Wash contaminated clothing before reusing.

In case of eye contact: Check for and remove any contact lenses. Immediately flush eyes with running water for at least 15 minutes, keeping eyelids open. Cold

water may be used. Do not use an eye ointment. Seek medical attention.

If swallowed: Do not induce vomiting. Rinse mouth with water. Examine the lips and mouth to ascertain whether the tissues are damaged, a possible

indication that the toxic material was ingested; the absence of such signs, however, is not conclusive. Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband. If the victim is not breathing, perform mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. Seek immediate medical attention.
